## 2025 ACEA and MSEA Elections are CONCURRENT!

Last year, for the first time, ACEA joined the MSEA Election cycle so that both ballots will come to you at the same time from MSEA, instead of two separate elections. It is our hope that more members will exercise their membership right to vote and we wanted to simplify this process as much as possible.
